Treasurer:

With recommendation from Treasurer Christine Redding, and after review by Solicitor Molly R. Mudd, Mr. Qually moved, seconded by Mr. Martin, that the Board of Commissioners approve the following:

- Addendum to the Master Agreement for Treasury Management Services dated July 14, 2021. The Addendum adds ACH Positive Pay Services, which is an additional layer of fraud-prevention for County ACH transactions. This Addendum is effective May 17, 2023. Cost of service is \$300.00 per month.
- Agreement for Collection of Germany Township Taxes by the County Treasurer. This
 Agreement, which was approved by the Germany Township Board of Supervisors on
 May 8, 2023, provides that Ms. Redding will be responsible for the collection of taxes
 in Germany Township due to a vacancy in the township tax collector position until
 December 31, 2023. The effective date of the Agreement is May 17, 2023. It is
 further recommended that the Board pass Resolution No. 5 of 2023, which directs
 Ms. Redding to collect Germany Township taxes, outlines the terms of the
 Agreement, and is required by the Local Tax Collection Law to effectuate the same.

RESOLUTION NO. 5 OF 2023

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF ADAMS THAT THE COUNTY TREASURER COLLECT TAXES FOR GERMANY TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Local Tax Collection Law, Public Law 1050 of 1945, as amended, codified at 72 P.S. § 5511.1, et seq., (the "Act") provides for the administration of duties for tax collectors in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, there exists a vacancy in Germany Township (hereafter "the Township") tax collector office, which has neither been filled by municipal election nor by the Township's efforts to appoint an interim tax collector; and

WHEREAS, the Adams County Board of Commissioners, by action taken this date, have directed the County Treasurer, Ms. Christine Redding, to collect taxes due and owing in Germany Township, pursuant to 72 P.S. § 5511.4d (permitting collection of municipal taxes by county treasurer), due to a vacancy in the position of the Township's Tax Collector; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Township wish to mutually acknowledge this assignment of tax collection responsibilities to the County Treasurer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Adams County Board of Commissioners as follows:

- 1. The Adams County Treasurer, Ms. Christine Redding, as assisted by her duly appointed and bonded staff, is appointed to collect all Township taxes beginning on May 1st, 2023 through December 31st, 2023, unless the Agreement is terminated by the parties or by operation of law.
- 2. This collection shall occur at the Adams County Courthouse, at the times and dates noted in the tax bills provided to Township taxpayers, or at such other location as may be duly determined and advertised by the Adams County Treasurer.

- 3. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Adams ("Board") hereby authorizes the County to enter into an agreement between the County of Adams and the Township, under the terms and conditions set forth in the agreement dated May 8th, 2023 and approved by the County on this date, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. The Office of the Adams County Treasurer shall have the duties and responsibilities to bill and collect all taxes due and owing in the Township, to properly manage all collected revenue, to pay over all collected taxes as required by statutes, laws and regulations, and to properly update all related tax duplicates and records.
- 5. The agreement between the County of Adams and the Township shall continue through December 31st, 2023, unless the agreement is terminated by the parties or by operation of law. Such tax collector duties shall then be undertaken by a duly elected Township Tax Collector, who will be elected in the 2023 Municipal Election, and who shall take office January 1, 2024, or by such other successor as elected or appointed in accordance with the law.

THIS RESOLUTION IS DULY ADOPTED ON this 17th day of May 2023, at a duly advertised meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Adams.

 Designate Chairman Randy L. Phiel to approve the Statement of Work from Sylint, LLC, a Florida Company, for a subscription for ongoing managed cybersecurity services which includes an initial security posture assessment, application testing, a series of penetration tests, and critical threat response support. Sylint will conduct strategic, tactical, and operational activities designed to protect and improve the cybersecurity posture of the County. It is further recommended that Chairman Phiel sign the Master Services Agreement with Sylint. The term of the Agreement is one (1) year, commencing on May 17, 2023 and terminating on May 16, 2024. Total cost to the County is \$83,160.00, which will be paid in monthly installments of \$6,930.00.

Local Government Entities Consent Agreement for the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP). By signing the Agreement, the County consents to the utilization of 80% of the FY 2022 SLCGP, or \$4,164,051.20, for Local Government Entities to use Intrusion and Detection Services MS-ISAC Albert Sensors and Cofense security awareness services. MS-ISAC Albert Sensors provide network security alerts for both traditional and advanced network threats, helping organizations identify malicious activity. Cofense provides for social engineering (phishing) exercises. To opt-in for these services, the County must submit the Consent Agreement no later than May 24, 2023. These services will be provided at no additional cost to the County and the Commonwealth will provide the required 10% match.

Phiel to sign Quote # Q-135073 from CentralSquare, a Florida Company, for consultant services to convert Budget and Purchasing's current CDD reports to Cognos Analytics reports. Cognos is CentralSquare's new report writer program. The Quote is effective May 17, 2023. Total cost to the County is \$8,640.00.

This extension request comes at no cost to the County and is effective May 17, 2023.
