**1.** How will the Institution, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school programs in order to continuously and safely open and operate school for in-person learning?

a. All ACACC educational activities and decisions will be informed by the PA DOH, PDE, and ACACC administration. Depending upon the public health conditions in Adams County and within the Commonwealth, there could be additional actions, orders, or guidance provided by the ACACC, the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) and/or the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH).

b. The ACACC is prepared to practice prevention and mitigation strategies along a continuum of most to least restrictive strategies in response to the changing conditions of the Pandemic.

c. The ACACC will continue to practice standard preventative measures such as handwashing and cleaning practices as well as standard mitigation efforts to include reducing close contact when feasible.

2. How will the Institution ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

a. Understanding that many scenarios may require a transition between independent, blended and face-to-face options, ACACC will communicate with stakeholders as the need arises to transition from brick and mortar to one of the other options mentioned above. Within programs, teachers will work together to create an effective learning system that highlights authentic learning experiences both in and out of the classroom. Teachers will create both synchronous and asynchronous experiences as students' transition between face-to-face instruction, hybrid, and independent learning. Teachers will provide direct instruction, guided support, one-on-one feedback, assessments, progress monitoring and therapies through a variety of in-person tools.

b. ACACC varied instructional plans from the LIU teacher consider the needs of diverse learners and families across unique programs. The plans provide options to engage learners in the ACT 30 program which is in alignment to the instructional time provisions with the use of distribution of materials/printed resources, and one-on-one conferencing. Options for individual, small group, and large group instruction in synchronous or asynchronous means were also considered. Additional considerations for special education support, related services, and English Learner supports will be integrated in partnership with the families and districts.

c. Instructional delivery will occur through the use of synchronous and asynchronous instruction, depending upon the public health conditions at the time.

d. As the circumstances evolve, ACACC will continue to work with the Lincoln Intermediate Unit 12 and agencies to adapt service delivery to meet the dynamic needs of families, students, and communities.

e. Attendance will be taken in school for all face-to-face learning days. On independent learning days, verification and completion of assignments will be counted as attendance. Students should complete work each day listed in their academic calendar, regardless of weather delays or closures.
